Club Programs

Awareness, Advocacy, and Action

In September we hosted our annual soup and dessert fundraiser in support of the National Council of Women. The funds raised from this event were donated to Circle of Friends, an organization that welcomes and assists asylum seekers and refugees as they navigate the challenging process of establishing themselves in Australia or face the difficulties of detention and asylum applications.

Talking Realities Scholarship Project



We partnered with SI Torrens to organize a joint movie fundraiser, featuring 'Downton Abbey-the Grand Finale' at the beautiful Capri Theatre in Goodwood. This joint event aimed to achieve three goals: raise funds for educational scholarships for participants in the Talking Realities program (a program for young pregnant and parenting individuals, enabling them to continue or start new studies), maximize our impact by combining efforts with SI Torrens to increase attendance, and strengthen the relationships between our two clubs. We are delighted to report that all three goals were achieved. The funds raised will be used to help four recent SACE graduates take driving lessons to improve their employability skills.

Circle of Friends Australia (COFA)

Our guest speaker was Janet Giles from Circle of Friends, Circle 108 whose presentation focused on Afghanistan and the increasing isolation faced by women under Taliban rule. Janet shared the story of Jamila, a Hazari science teacher and mother of four, who sought help after her husband's disappearance in 2023. Circle 108 raised over \$100,000 in two years to enable Jamila and her family reach safety in Adelaide. The journey was traumatic, requiring many hours of hard work and networking by group members. The group continued to support the family after arrival assisting with housing, medical expenses, and more. The daughters are now attending St Aloysious College—a chance they would not have had in Afghanistan—while Jamila attends English language classes at TAFE.

October Events

Annual October Awards Night

We welcomed Peggy Jackson, the 2025 Olive Johnston Travel Scholarship winner, as club speaker. Peggy is currently studying for a Bachelor of Speech Pathology at Flinders University and used her scholarship to fund a study trip to Thailand. There, she worked with children and young adults—mostly nonverbal and on the autism spectrum—in community project centers in Bangkok. Her primary role was to engage participants in play-based communication activities, often working alongside translators to overcome language barriers. Peggy shared that she learned a great deal about cultural diversity, flexible needsbased program delivery, and working within a very different education system. She expressed her gratitude for the opportunity. Peggy was also the guest speaker at the October membership development seminar.

Seeds of Affinity Project

Lisa formally launched our annual Christmas sparkling wine sale, with proceeds going to Seeds of Affinity—a charity that supports women recently released from prison as they transition back into the community. Safe Pets, Safe Families (SPSF) Update

In October, a social media post about Safe Pets Safe Families' need for funds caught the attention of member Marrion. Our club has supported this important organization in the past and has come to know its founder, Jennifer Howard. Due to a recent loss of donors, SPSF had to refuse 60 pet foster placements—an especially difficult situation as they provide foster care for pets of women in need. After our October meeting, a quick email exchange resulted in members agreeing to donate \$500 to SPSF right away. While this is only a small contribution to their overall costs, it was greatly appreciated. Marrion recently checked in with Jennifer and learned that SPSF is preparing to launch a Vet Van in early

December, providing veterinary services to homeless and financially struggling individuals. Staffed by veterinarians, vet students, and vet nurses, this is wonderful initiative by Jennifer and her team. SPSF's website is user-friendly, with a prominent "Donate" button. Regional Roundup

SISA Regional Meeting

At our recent SI South Australia meeting, the morning speaker was Justine Reynolds, creator and owner of Woodleigh Hills natural products. The meeting was hosted by SI Northern Highlands (Jamestown) at Sir Hubert Wilkins Aerodrome in Jamestown, named after the oftenoverlooked Australian explorer and innovator. Justine lives on a farm near Jamestown with her husband and five children. In August 2023, she launched her Woodleigh Hills products, which harness the healing properties of locally grown Australian native plants—many grown on her own property. Justine, who suffers from a rare illness called 'semi superior canal dehiscence', uses her Wilma rub daily for relief. Each product contains a maximum of four ingredients: the plant, olive oil, and beeswax, with some products soon to be available as a spray. Justine expressed her gratitude to a mentor from the Adelaide Hills for their invaluable support. Woodleigh Hills products are available from many stockists. Member Development Meeting

We held our member development meeting in October and were pleased to welcome two speakers, Danielle Hughes and Peggy Jackson. Both young women shared inspiring stories about their work. Here is a brief summary for those who were unable to attend. Danielle is an experimental physicist and surface scientist. She discussed the work she has conducted during her PhD., particularly about nuclear fusion reactors. When exposed to extreme temperatures and particle bombardment, the materials lining the inside wall of a nuclear fusion reactor see surface and subsurface damage which decreases their lifetime. Danielle has been developing nanolayers of diamond-like carbon and tungsten



to act as protective coatings against helium particles, a product of the nuclear fusion reaction. In her talk she discussed different layer configurations from single layers, up to 16 alternating layers. After exposure to helium plasma, the damage observed depends on the initial configuration and exposure temperature. She highlighted that thin layers appear to reduce surface and sub-surface damage to the underlaying material.

Peggy is in her final year of studying speech pathology and is about to embark on a year of placements in rural South Australia, from her home in Lucindale! Her special interest is in diagnosing and treating communication and swallowing disorders across all ages. These disorders include issues related to speech sounds, language comprehension and expression, voice q uality, fluency (such as stuttering), and social communication skills. Peggy is SI Adelaide's 2025 Olive Johnston Travel Award scholarship winner and we are proud to have played a small part in her journey.
